Focus of Joni & Friends

Nearly 1 billion people around the world live with some kind of disability. Many of these individuals and their families live in poverty, pain, and despair. Joni and Friends family camp is committed to bringing the Gospel and practical resources to people who are impacted by disability around the globe.

Am I Equipped?

Prior experience is not required. Joni and Friends will ensure that you feel prepared to serve by providing training on topics such as disability etiquette and God's view of disability. Team members arrive one day before the families and receive training on disability and behavioral support. Plus, you will receive ongoing support from great experienced leaders all week.



The Challenge

Each year, there is a need for teens and young adults to serve. It is more fun for a child, teen, or young adult to have a buddy for the week that is closer to their age. In the past, most family retreats have lacked the number of teens and young adults serving as these critical volunteers. Let's continue to build on the momentum from last year.

Most volunteers will serve as a friend to a child or adult with a disability joining the participant for all meals, programming, and free time activities such as boating, swimming, and crafts. Volunteers may also serve in a specific program area such as worship, crafts, recreation, and other activites.

The main goal is to simply love and encourage your buddy with a willing and humble heart for the week. As a member of this team, you'll work alongside others from around the region.

Many volunteers mark their calendar year after year to return. Some have the same buddy for 5, 10, 20+ years. For many, ministry with people who have special needs becomes a significant part of their lives.
